Narnia Book Study

We continue our study of the Chronicles of Narnia by C.S. Lewis on Wednesday, Sept 27th, at 1:30pm, when we discuss the next book in the series, A Horse And His Boy. Discussion starts at 1:30pm, but all are welcome to come early and share a pot-luck lunch with the folks from the Bible Study.

"All Saints" is a common name for Anglican and Church of England churches. Father Michael has provided us with the history of one of our oldest namesakes, All Saints Church in York, England.

A Namesake Church in York, England

Not far from the River Ouse in the heart of York, England, is a namesake church, All Saints, North Street. I mentioned this church briefly in the last edition of ASA but thought a long description of it might be of interest.

While our church here in Collingwood is old for a Canadian church, All Saints, York, was a Saxon church first built in the tenth century, though nothing from the original church survives. Today the walls, ceilings and stained glass date from the 14th and 15th centuries; the oldest window dates from 1330.

The church was one of several in medieval England that was home to an anchoress. In late medieval England, an anchoress was a holy woman who had visions and who devoted herself to prayer and worship. Julian of Norwich is a famous example. All Saints, York, was home to several of these women, who lived in a specially built house or anchorhold attached to the back of the church, and who could observe the services through a special window, or "squint".

Of the All Saints anchoresses, the most well known was Emma Roughton, who in 1421 had a series of visions of the Virgin Mary.

All Saints is also home to a rare medieval statue of St. William of York, a12th century Archbishop. William is said to have died from a chalice that was poisoned by a rival during the mass; church politics were very hardball in those days!

A statue of the Blessed Virgin Mary is also prominent and is reverenced during the liturgy. As you might therefore expect, the flavour of All Saints, York, is very high Anglo-Catholic, and the scent of incense mingles with the ancient stone and wood as you enter.

The interior is graceful and very well cared for by an active congregation. Perhaps one day we can organize a pilgrimage there! You can find the church website at www.allsaints-nothstreet.org.uk

The church spire was built around 1395; it is now obscured by nearby shops and hotels, but is the tallest spire in York apart from the Minster.

Back to Church Sunday will be September 17th. Fr. Michael has organized a speaker from Samaritan House in Barrie, and we are working with the Welcome Committee to provide a light lunch after the service. Please bring your friends and family to share this with us.


