As the old Prayer Book reminds us, "grateful hearts" are a gift of God that is cultivated through prayer and worship. It takes a prayerful mind to think of creation when others think of nature. It takes a worshipful heart to appreci-

ate the cycle of seasons, from spring buds to fall crops, as part of God's design to feed and care for us.

The food, plants, and decorations that we bring into church at Thanksgiving are thus prayerful and worshipful ways of cultivating our grateful hearts. These decorations remind us that God provides, and within the scope of our own lives, some of us find it quite easy to be grateful for our comfortable homes, for our families and for our rich, full lives, and of course our beautiful church.

However, a truly grateful heart is a gift of the Holy Spirit that comes from Jesus who stands in the midst of our Christian community. A truly grateful heart is thus a restless heart because it is also Christ's heart.

A truly grateful heart sees beyond personal comforts to the needs of others, especially at this time of great insecurity in food and shelter. A truly grateful heart sees the groaning of creation in this time of climate change, and seeks the good of the world that God gave us.


