

Mansard Roof:

Definition: Like a gambrel roof, a mansard roof has two slopes on each side, with the upper being less steep and shorter than the lower slope.

Sometime between 1874-1877 the addition of this section with the mansard roof was added to the east side of the transept on Elgin Street.

The Mansard design roof houses the organ pipes as seen to the right.

ALL SAINTS' FOOD MINISTRY

Our Food Ministry is back in full swing after a summer of barbecues and salads. This month we had two dinners, serving 186 meals to the community. The Five Loaves dinners were delivered to the Busby Centre, and to some 50 people confined to their homes, and to the Mobile Soup Kitchen for their deliveries to those in need around Collingwood. Our Friendship dinner provided 85 guests with a hot meal served in our Parish Hall, with plenty of left-overs to take home. A HUGE thank you goes out to all our wonderful volunteers, without you this would not happen.

This vital ministry is a very important part of our Parish Outreach commitment, and our guests rely on it during this time of food insecurity.

We have recently installed a Little Food Pantry box at All Saints, which will be filled regularly with non-perishable food and personal items, and is accessible 24/7 to those in need. We hope to keep the pantry stocked with donated items which can be delivered to the church and left in the bins inside the doors. A list of suggested items can be fund on our website.




