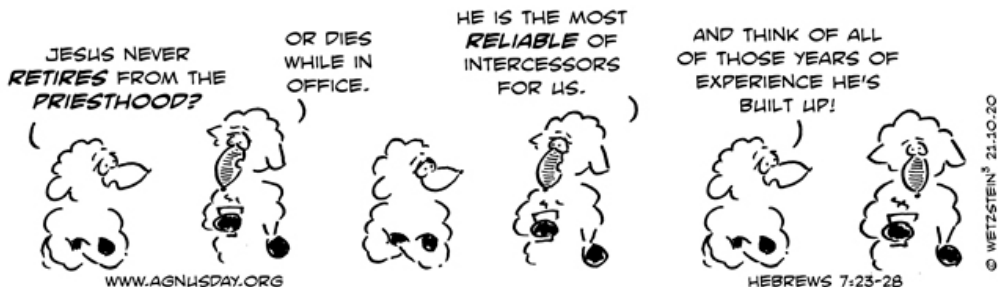

Commemoration of the Faithful Departed
Liturgy From the Book of Common Prayer

On Saturday, November 2nd at 7pm, at All Saints, Collingwood, we will again observe the Feast of All Souls, also known in the church as The Commemoration of the Faithful Departed.

This is the time of the church year when we are called to give thanks for the lives of the saints and loved ones gone before us, and to pray for their repose until we are reunited with them in God's eternal presence.

All are welcome to this communion service, which will use the liturgy for Holy Communion from the Book of Common Prayer. It will be a sung service using the traditional communion music from Merbecke. Please be aware that some incense will be used during this service.

All are invited to bring a photo or portrait of those who are on your hearts at this time, and we will gather them together before the service begins.
