Acknowledgment of Indigenous Territory

We acknowledge that our parish of All Saints', Collingwood, resides on the traditional lands of the Anishnaabeg (Ojibwe), Haudenosaunee (Iroquois), and Wendat (Huron) peoples, who cared for these lands for more than 15,000 years. While I was still young, before I went on my travels, I sought wisdom openly in my prayer. Before the temple I asked for her, and I will search for her until the end.

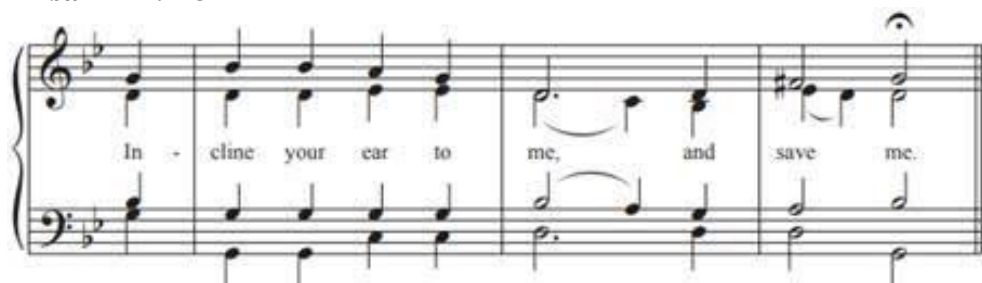
From the first blossom to the ripening grape my heart delighted in her; my foot walked on the straight path; from my youth I followed her steps.

The Holy Gospel John 1:1-18 (*please stand*)

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it.

There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. He came as a witness to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. He himself was not the light, but he came to testify to the light. The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world.

He was in the world, and the world came into being through him; yet the world did not know him. He came to what was his own, and his own people did not accept him. But to all who received him, who believed in his name, he gave power to become children of God, who were born, not of blood or of the will of the flesh or of the will of man, but of God.

And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth. (John testified to him and cried out, 'This was he of whom I said, "He who comes after me ranks ahead of me because he was before me." ') From his fullness we have all received, grace upon grace. The law indeed was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. No one has ever seen God. It is God the only Son, who is close to the Father's heart, who has made him known.

The Presentation

Presenters Riscylla, bishop in the Church of God, on behalf of the clergy and people of the Diocese of Toronto, we present you Amy Mary Katherine Pauley, to be ordained a priest in Christ's holy catholic Church.

Bishop Has she been selected in accordance with the canons and customs of this Church? And do you believe her manner of life to be suitable to the exercise of this ministry?

Presenters **We certify to you that she has been duly selected, and we believe her to be qualified for this order.**

Bishop Amy, will you be loyal to the doctrine, discipline, and worship of Christ as this Church has received them? And will you, in accordance with the canons of this Church, obey your bishop and other ministers who may have authority over you and your work?

Ordinand **I am willing and ready to do so; and I solemnly declare that I do believe the holy scriptures of the Old and New Testaments to be the word of God, and to contain all things necessary to salvation; and I do solemnly promise to conform to the doctrine, discipline, and worship of the Anglican Church of Canada.**

The ordinand then signs the above declaration in the sight of all present.

All stand.

Bishop Dear friends in Christ, you know the importance of this ministry, and the weight of your responsibility in presenting Amy for ordination to the sacred order of priesthood. Therefore, if any of you know any impediment or crime for which we should not proceed, come forward now, and make it known.

If no objection is made, the bishop continues,

Bishop Is it your will that Amy be ordained a deacon/priest?

All **It is.**

Bishop Will you uphold her in this ministry?

All **We will.**

The Examination

All now sit except the ordinand, who stands before the bishop.

Bishop Amy, the Church is the family of God, the body of Christ, and the temple of the Holy Spirit. All baptized people are called to make Christ known as Saviour and Lord, and to share in the renewing of God's world. Now you are called to work as a pastor, priest, and teacher, together with your bishop and fellow presbyters, and to take your share in the councils of the Church.

As a priest, it will be your task to proclaim by word and deed the gospel of Jesus Christ, and to fashion your life in accordance with its precepts. You are to love and serve the people among whom you work, caring alike for young and old, strong and weak, rich and poor. You are to preach, to declare God's forgiveness to penitent sinners, to pronounce God's blessing, to preside at the administration of holy baptism and at the celebration of the mysteries of Christ's body and blood, and to perform the other ministrations entrusted to you. In all that you do, you are to nourish Christ's people from the riches of his grace, and strengthen them to glorify God in this life and in the life to come.

Do you believe that you are truly called by God and God's Church to this priesthood?

Ordinand **I believe I am so called.**

Bishop Do you now in the presence of the Church commit yourself to this trust and responsibility?

Ordinand **I do.**

Bishop Will you respect and be guided by the pastoral direction and leadership of your bishop?

Ordinand **I will.**

Bishop Will you be diligent in the reading and study of the holy scriptures, and in seeking the knowledge of such things as may make you a stronger and more able minister of Christ?

- Ordinand** **I will.**
Bishop Will you endeavour so to minister the word of God and the sacraments of the new covenant, that the reconciling love of Christ may be known and received?
- Ordinand** **I will.**
Bishop Will you undertake to be a faithful pastor to all whom you are called to serve, labouring together with them and with your fellow ministers to build up the family of God?
- Ordinand** **I will.**
Bishop Will you do your best to pattern your life in accordance with the teachings of Christ, so that you may be a wholesome example to your people?
- Ordinand** **I will.**
Bishop Will you persevere in prayer, both in public and in private, asking God's grace, both for yourself and for others, and offering all your labours to God, through the mediation of Jesus Christ, and in the sanctification of the Holy Spirit?
- Ordinand** **I will.**
Bishop May the Lord who has given you the will to do these things give you the grace and power to perform them.

A period of silent prayer follows.

The bishop then stands (with the priests who assist her), the ordinand still kneeling before her.

Bishop We praise and glorify you, almighty O Holy one of Blessings, because you have formed throughout the world a holy people for your own possession, a royal priesthood, a universal Church. We praise and glorify you because you have given us your only Son Jesus Christ to be the Apostle and High Priest of our faith, and the Shepherd of our souls. We praise and glorify you that by his death he has overcome death; and that, having ascended into heaven, he has given his gifts abundantly to your people, making some, apostles; some, prophets; some, evangelists; some, pastors and teachers; to equip them for the work of ministry and to build up his Body. And now we give you thanks that you have called this your servant to share this ministry entrusted to your Church. Send down your Holy Spirit upon your servant Amy, whom we consecrate in your name to the office and work of a priest in the Church.

Bishop Almighty God, give to this your servant grace and power to fulfil her ministry among the people committed to her charge; to watch over them and care for them; to absolve and bless them in your name; and to proclaim the gospel of your salvation. Set her among your people to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable in your sight, and as you have called her to your service, make her by the gift of your Holy Spirit worthy of her calling. Give her wisdom and discipline to work faithfully with all her fellow servants in Christ, that the world may come to know your glory and your love. Accept our prayers, most merciful God, through your Son Jesus Christ our Lord, to whom, with you and your Holy Spirit, belong glory and honour, worship and praise, now and for ever.
