#### What is Pentecost?



Pentecost is one of the most important and celebrated events in the Christian calendar. It commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles and followers of Jesus Christ, as described in the book of Acts. This miraculous event, which occurred fifty days after Easter, marks the birth of the Christian Church and the beginning of its mission to spread the Gospel to all nations.

#### What is Pentecost Sunday?

Pentecost, derived from the Greek word "Pentekoste" meaning "fiftieth," is celebrated on the seventh Sunday after Easter. In the Old Testament, it was known as the Feast of Weeks (Shavuot) and celebrated the end of the grain harvest and the giving of the Torah at Mount Sinai. For Christians, Pentecost signifies the fulfillment of Jesus' promise to send the Holy Spirit to His disciples.

#### The story of Pentecost is found in the book of Acts, chapter 2:

Acts 2:1-4 (KJV): "And when the day of Pentecost was fully come, they were all with one accord in one place. And suddenly there came a sound from heaven as of a rushing mighty wind, and it filled all the house where they were sitting. And there appeared unto them cloven tongues like as of fire, and it sat upon each of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Ghost, and began to speak with other tongues, as the Spirit gave them utterance."

On that day, the apostles were gathered in Jerusalem when the Holy Spirit descended upon them in the form of tongues of fire. They began to speak in different languages, enabling them to preach the Gospel to people from various nations who had come to Jerusalem for the feast. This miraculous event marked the beginning of the apostles' public ministry and the spread of Christianity.

Our church Food Ministries continue to provide outreach for those in our community who are in need. Five Loaves provided meals to close to 100 individuals at the Busby Centre, the Mobile Soup Kitchen and to shut ins in our town. Thanks go out to Sharon Goldsworthy, Gill Elias and their team of dedicated volunteers. And we salute Penny Bourne and Paulette de Silva and their group of volunteers for an amazing Community Friendship Dinner on Wednesday of this week.

**SMP Training** - Sexual Misconduct Policy training on Thursday, June 26th, from 7pm to 8:15pm at Good Shepherd, Stayner.

This training is for all those in medium and high-risk ministry roles, including clergy, employees, and volunteers. New ministry roles require a Sexual Misconduct Policy workshop within the first year, and all parish leadership is required to attend the workshop every three years. The training aims to help individuals understand their obligations and responsibilities in creating and maintaining a safe environment, particularly for children, seniors, and the vulnerable.
