Guest Preacher for Sunday June 22nd

On June 22nd the Anglican Church of Canada observes the National Indigenous Day of Prayer. Our guest preacher this Sunday will be Captain the Rev. Michael Bowyer, the Padre for the 3rd Canadian Ranger Patrol Group, based at CFB Borden. The Rangers are a largely indigenous part of the Canadian Armed Forces, responsible for maintaining the sovereignty of Canada's North. Padre Bowyer will speak about the work of the Rangers, and the challenges faced by indigenous communities in Northern Ontario.
