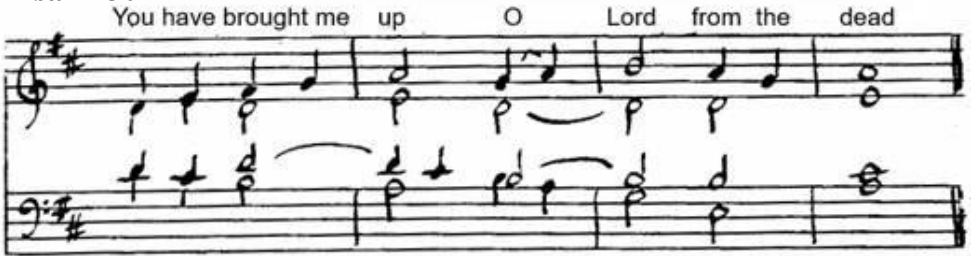

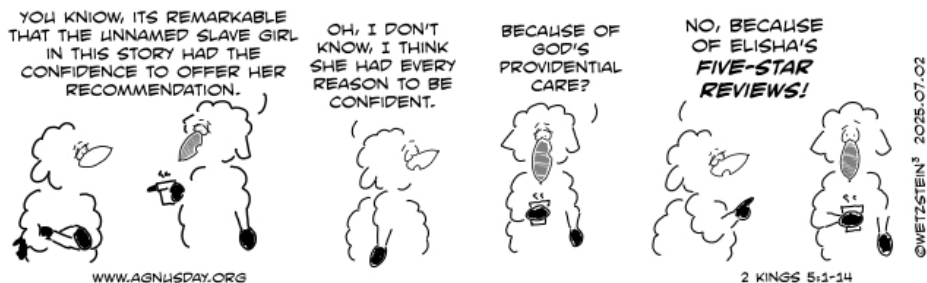

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Acknowledgment of Indigenous Territory

We acknowledge that our parish of All Saints', Collingwood, resides on the traditional lands of the Anishnaabeg (Ojibwe), Haudenosaunee (Iroquois), and Wendat (Huron) peoples, who cared for these lands for more than 15,000 years.
