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Acknowledgment of Indigenous Territory

We acknowledge that our parish of All Saints', Collingwood, resides on the traditional lands of the Anishnaabeg (Ojibwe), Haudenosaunee (Iroquois), and Wendat (Huron) peoples, who cared for these lands for more than 15,000 years. We acknowledge that these lands are included in Treaty 18, the Lake Simcoe-Nottawasaga Treaty, as well as three other treaties signed between 1818 and 1819.
