1. Draft-Proofing Isn't Just a Winter Thing, Eh

Pro tip: Sealing leaks not only helps in summer but pays off again during the winter months.

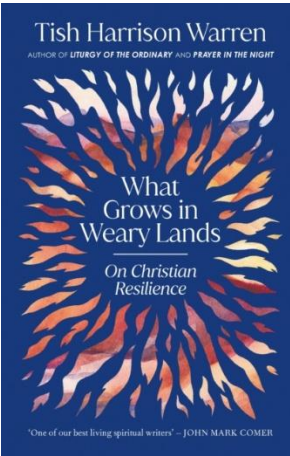
